Met Council Transportation Committee Approves Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP)

The Metropolitan Council Transportation Committee recently approved the 2019-2022 Transportation Improvement Plan (TIP). The TIP addresses transportation projects in the region that are prioritized by year and that use federal funds or have effects on air quality. Projects include highways, transit, bikeway and pedestrian improvements. All metropolitan planning organizations (MPOs) must draft a TIP. Metro Cities has been asked to share updated information from Metropolitan Council staff:

• **UPCOMING DEADLINE**: Communities can continue to submit the draft of their comprehensive plans to the Metropolitan Council for preliminary plan review using the Local Planning Handbook Online Submittal through the <u>Community Pages</u> until <u>September 30, 2018</u>. Please contact your <u>Sector Representative</u> if you have any questions.

• **UPDATED**: Updated Affected Jurisdictions Contact List to include contacts for MDH, MnDNR, MnDOT, as well as all seven metro area counties: Anoka, Carver, Dakota, Hennepin, Ramsey, Scott, Washington. Comprehensive plans must be submitted to the appropriate affected jurisdictions, before submitting it to the Metropolitan Council for review.

• **Minnesota Department of Health** has a new grant opportunity available to all community and nontransient noncommunity public water supply systems who have an MDH approved Wellhead Protection Plan, or MDH-endorsed intake protection plan. The purpose of this funding is to help public water suppliers implement source water protection measures included in their WHP plan. These grants do not require a cost share. The minimum grant amount is \$1,000 and the

maximum grant amount is \$10,000. Deadline for applications is **4:30 PM September 28, 2018**. To download an application form and to review more detailed information about this grant program, please go to <u>MDH website</u>.
